Entry Fee: Entry fee for each individual competitor and/or each team is CAD\$20. Adapted Taekwon-Do Category is \$FREE.

Payments must be made via Paypal where you will also have the choice to use your credit card if you do not have a Paypal account.

If competition fees are not paid in full by April 1, 2021 competitors will not be allowed to participate in this eTournament.

Registration:

All competitors must be registered by their Coach directly through the SportData system. This will require each coach to create a Club account in SportData to register the members of their club or dojang.

See the additional document "Coach competitor registration instructions" for a tutorial showing how to create an account and how to register competitors. This document is found under the "Downloads" button on the SportData web page for the event.

NOTE: all Black Belt competitors in Junior and Senior individual categories must include their ITF Online ID number/International number in their registration. This number can be found on the Black Belt wallet card (see image below circled in red).



Competitors who have recently examined for a new Black Belt rank (including First Degree) but have not yet received their new number and certificate, please enter "PENDING" as the ID number. This will be confirmed with CTFI headquarters.

AGE FOR CATEGORIES: This tournament will offer categories based on the age of the competitor on the first day of the event.

<u>**COACHES Important Note</u>**: Under the ITF and CTFI rules, Black Belt competitors who are age 17 at any time during 2021 must qualify as Junior. However, when registering a Black Belt who has turned age 18 after December 31, 2020, you may be offered only a Senior category. This is a limitation between the SportData system and the convoluted age qualification system of the ITF. Go ahead and select the Senior category, but please send a message to the Tournament Director to note this has happened so it can be corrected.

NOTE: This schedule is subject to modification depending on how many competitors enrol, how many categories are created and how many Umpires are available.

Umpires

We will need 30 or more umpires to make the event successful and keep the workload for everyone reasonable. We especially need judges with 4th degree or higher. Judges with 1st to 3rd degree are encouraged to enrol and to help with judging the lower ranks.

This is a great opportunity for Black Belts to keep their patterns judging skills up to speed.

Instructors/Coaches, we need your help to recruit umpires from your members. Please do your best to have some of your senior members help as umpires.

***Black Belts can be both competitors and umpires for this event.

Umpires need to have a good high speed internet connection to judge in an eTournament.

1. Umpires must apply for participation through the CTFI Umpire Director, Master Scott Downey until March 25, 2021. Download the document "Umpire Application Form" and send the information to <u>scott.downey@nl.rogers.com</u>.

Cutoff for Umpire applications is March 25, 2021.

2. Umpires must create an account as E-Referee for themselves in Sportdata and register as an umpire for the event. See the Download document "Umpire Application Instructions" for details. This document is found under the "Downloads" button on the SportData web page for the event.

Do this at the same time you send your application to the Umpire Director.

3. The Umpire Director will select the umpires for the event from the applicants and they will be confirmed in the SportData system. A meeting will be held before the event begins to teach the selected umpires how to do their job.

Competition Rules

The event takes place under the ITF World Championships Rules and Regulations, including all appendices: <u>http://www.taekwondoitf.org/rules/#rules-regulations</u>, and also the CTFI Rules for Colour Belt Competition: <u>http://www.ctfi.org/wp-content/uploads/2019/08/CTFI-Competition-Rules-2017-Final.pdf</u>

Additional specific rules for an E-Tournament:

The following special eTournament rules are in addition to ITF and CTFI Rules and Regulations as listed above. Any other exceptions/modifications to the rules will be discussed in the coaches meetings.

Color Belts, Black Belts age 11 and under, Black Belts age 46+:

Will perform 1 optional pattern chosen from those allowed for their category. Allowed Patterns will be published on the Sportdata website before competition begins.

Black Belts age 12 to 45:

Will perform 2 designated patterns, random drawn by Sportdata and published on the Sportdata website before competition begins.

Pre-Arranged Sparring:

Open to all-male, all-female and mixed-gender teams. 60-75 seconds between sijak and goman as written in the ITF WC-rules.

Competition

For each round of competition, the Sportdata system will create a new daily Match-Code (created by Sportdata and published on the Sportdata website). Competitors have to make and upload a new video that must show the new daily Match-Code for this round.

Full details for making and uploading videos are in the accompanying documents: "How to Create A Competition Video" and "Coaches How to Upload Videos". These documents are found under the "Downloads" button on the SportData web page for the event.

Coaches Note: Some of you may not be operating out of your physical Dojang and only on video training. These students will probably have to make their own videos to give to you for uploading. To help you and them, we have prepared a document that you can edit and give to your competitors to help them prepare for the competition and to help them create their videos. If you want a copy of this document to help you, please send an email to the Tournament Director.

Categories

Individual Patterns

Competitors will be divided into categories based on age, gender and rank. A list of categories is provided separately. Competition will be by Single Knockout Elimination. A new video will have to be recorded and uploaded on each day that a competitor is in competition.

NOTE: Black Belts age 36+ can select to compete in a Senior category (age 18-35).

Adapted Taekwon-Do Patterns and Partner Skills

Each of these demonstration categories include all ages and ranks. Competitors will only create and upload 1 video in each category. Full details below.

Prearranged Sparring

This event is open to colour belts and black belts. Teams will be divided into categories based on age and rank.

Category Merging/Splitting

Categories with less than 3 competitors may be combined with other categories. Categories with a large number of competitors may be divided into smaller categories.

Adapted Taekwon-Do / Special Needs Categories

For this tournament, these divisions are EXHIBITION ONLY events. It is FREE to enter these events. The purpose is to give our special needs students a platform to showcase their skills and prepare them for competitions in the future. Participants will receive a Certificate of Participation.

- 1. Competitors with any of the following conditions are allowed:
 - Motor/Physical Impairment including loss, malformation or abnormality in the skeletal, muscular or neurological systems responsible for body motion. E.g. Those suffering polio, spinal cord injuries, paralysis, amputations.
 - Sensory Impairment: For those with severe visual impairments, severe hearing impairments and those with language and communication disabilities that prevents them from competing in regular competition divisions. E.g. Blind, deaf, mute.
 - Intellectual: For those characterized by a decline in higher mental functions (intelligence, language, learning, etc) as well as motor functions. This covers a wide variety of diseases and disorders including Down Syndrome, Autism, Cerebral Palsy, Asperger, Tourettes, to name a few.

NOTE: All condition form information will be deleted at the end of the event, April 23, 2021.

2. There are 2 categories which your participant can enter.

You can select one or both when you register your competitor for the event. If you choose to do both you must submit 2 separate videos.

- I. **Adapted Patterns,** the competitor performs their pattern on their own. The pattern can be adapted to their specific needs. Coaching is allowed by voice and action but only the student must be on-camera in the video.
- II. Partner Skills is a 30 to 60 second collaboration between the competitor and 1 or 2 other assistants (may or may not be Taekwon-Do people). They may perform a variety of Taekwon-Do related activities to highlight the martial arts skills they have learned. The goal is to keep it fun and interesting for both participants and viewers. Examples include Partner patterns, choreographed Sparring or Self-Defence, Callisthenic exercises or stretching techniques, Power breaking or flying kick skills, bag or pad work, etc.
- 3. *Accepted Videos:* For these exhibition categories, edited or unedited videos may be submitted to a maximum length of 60 seconds and a maximum of 150Mbytes in file size. Competitor must bow in the beginning and end of the video. You do not require the daily match code. Your video(s) may be uploaded at any time from Competition start April 14, 2021 until Competition end April 21, 2021. This includes days when regular categories are being judged. See schedule above.

Equipment Regulations

Competitors must wear a full ITF official dobok in their videos. See ITF Rules and Regulations <u>https://itftkd.sport/wp-content/uploads/2020/03/ITF-Umpire-Rules-Appendix-2-ITF-Approved-Clothing-Feb-3-2017.pdf</u>

Competitors may also wear the older, traditional style dobok with the vertical ITF logo on the legs and only the traditional ITF crest on the left chest.

Adornment on the right chest can be national flag, club logo or nothing.

Sponsorship logos are acceptable if they meet the requirements listed in the ITF regulations above.

Country name is not required on the back, but is acceptable if it is present.

No jewellery, piercings, watches or other adornments may be worn, hair may be kept in place using a material of a soft elastic nature only.

No shoes or other footwear.

Female competitors only may wear a <u>white</u> t-shirt under the dobok top.

Awards

All competitors will receive a certificate of participation as well as a certificate of final finish. In addition, special graphic "podiums" will be published on the CTFI web site showing photos of the top 4 finishers in each category.

Declaration of Consent and Data Protection

All competitors <u>must</u> sign the consent form which must be sent to the Tournament Director no later than April 1, 2021. The form is found under the "Downloads" button on the SportData web page for the event.

Competitors without signed forms will not be allowed to participate.
